"Community Conversations is one strategy that has been used to <u>discover, support, and disseminate creative and promising approaches</u> for supporting students with disabilities to participate more fully and naturally in school, work, and community activities, including the same relationships, work, and community experiences as their peers."

"Community Conversations is an organizational tool that promotes a stage for dialogue. By drawing out the best ideas of parents, educators, service providers, community leaders, employers, and ordinary citizens, communities can discover they already have the capacity to open doors for real change in this area."

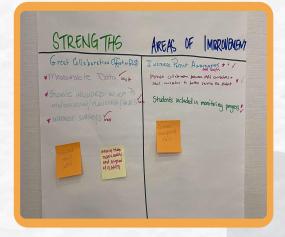

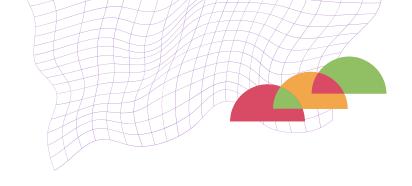
